Dear Eden Members, Attendees, and Friends:

Perhaps our attendance isn't what it ought to be, perhaps our Bible reading isn't what it ought to be, perhaps our prayer life isn't what it ought to be, perhaps our tithing isn't what it ought to be, perhaps sharing our faith walk isn't what it ought to be, perhaps our reaching out to others isn't what it ought to be. Perhaps there are more we might list here but **this is enough to give us pause to examine our walk with the Lord.**

God, as he was speaking to Jeremiah, offered these words of hope and promise to the captive nation of Israel.

Jer 29:11 ESV For I know the plans I have for you, declares the LORD, plans for welfare and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope.

We may not know what God has in store for us in the coming year but let's take hold of Jeremiah 29:11 knowing full well that God has a plan for each one of us connected to Eden Baptist Church.

Perhaps we will be willing to be the clay vessel in the Potter's hand and take to heart to words of the hymn writer Adelaide Pollard, "Have Thine Own Way Lord."

With an open heart and a willing spirit, what a year it will be!
