When you are faithful, you engage in a life-time encounter with the God of salvation. When you are religious, being part of a church is as you should. When you are faithful, you find a church that gives you life and energy. When you are religious, the Bible is something you want to read. When you are faithful, the Bible is a living part of your soul. Churches spend enormous energy 'being religious.' They use committee meetings, goal-setting sessions, and volunteer time to care for their institutional maintenance and survival. These churches, for the most part, have reached a plateau or are in the throes of decline. The churches that are filled with energy are those that remember their primary reason for existence. They don't just "believe in God"; they know God. Knowing God, they engage the journey of faith, and they invite others to join them."
